

RFI's and Program Area Allocations Approved

In preparation for the Levy's 2019-20 funding round, the Allocation Committee approved key remaining elements of the draft <u>Requests for Investments</u> final versions of which will be posted on the Levy website Sept. 25th.

AC members also allocated resources between Levy program areas for the upcoming competitive funding round. Resources are projected to total \$69 million over 3 years: July 2020 - June 2023. The three-year allocations per program area listed below reflect community priorities and Levy ballot requirements, and all include increases from current spending levels:

Early Childhood: \$21.3 million Child Abuse Prevention/Intervention: \$13.7 million After School: \$13 million Foster Care: \$7.5 million Hunger Relief: \$7.5 million Mentoring: \$6.2 million

Staff reviewed the <u>timeline and next steps</u> in the upcoming funding process. Highlights are:

- Publish RFI: Sept. 25th
- Pre-proposal Conferences: Oct. 9th & Oct. 10th
- RFI due: Nov. 20th
- RFI review period: Dec. 4th Jan. 31st
- Applicant written testimony due: March 18th
- Video testimony taped: Between March 20 April 3rd
- Funding decision meetings: By April 30th (Applicants will be notified of meeting dates/times by March 1st)

Finally, staff gave an update on the hiring of a Levy Small Grants Fund Manager. The recruitment period closed, and the city's Human Resources Department is currently screening applicants; interviews are planned for late September/early-mid October, with the hope that the new Levy staffer can begin in November.


