Meeting News

Review of Funding Process and Community Engagement Plan

The Allocation Committee approved the draft plan for the Community Engagement project to develop recommendations and inform funding priorities and strategies for the next funding round in 2019-20. The AC also heard an update on the Grantmaking Improvement project to gather input on Levy processes, practices and operations.

The graphic below illustrates the timeline for these two efforts, and a more detailed breakdown on both can be found on the Levy website, along with the full Community Engagement Plan and a request for feedback.

Levy staff anticipates that the AC will meet three to four times between January and June 2019 to make decisions on both plans.



In other matters, the AC welcomed a new member, Felicia Tripp Folsom, appointed by Multnomah County. Currently deputy director of the Portland Housing Center, she is also a board member of All Hands Raised, an executive board member of the Portland African American Leadership Forum and chair of the Community Housing Fund. 

Who We Are

The Portland Children's Levy was created by city voters in 2002 and overwhelmingly renewed for the third time by the electorate in May 2018. Funding for the new five-year Levy begins July 1, 2019 and runs through June 30, 2024.

The Levy is supported through a property tax paid by City of Portland homeowners that generates \$21 million toward investments in proven programs in areas of Early Childhood, After School, Mentoring, Child Abuse Prevention/Intervention, Foster Care and Hunger Relief. The Levy reaches over 8,000 children and their families annually; in addition, Levy-funded hunger relief services provide food to over 11,000 children and 9,167 parents/caregivers annually.
